The VCB has many attractions that appeal to student groups where they experience and learn firsthand about nature at the Wilds, our county's past at the Guernsey County History Museum and how to canoe, shoot a bow and arrow or learn about our deer population at Deerassic Park Education Center.

Special events are an important part to enticing groups (or individuals) to travel to any destination. The Annual Dickens Victorian Village event draws dozens of motorcoaches to the area each holiday season. Bev Kerr does a great job of working with groups who want to experience the holiday season in our area. This year, Gerald Dickens, the great-great grandson of literary icon, Charles Dickens will once again return to Cambridge.
