Ohio Creativity Trail: 250 Years in the Making. Join us for two stops in Guernsey County.

Ohio's natural resources helped make it a hub for glass and pottery with Cambridge standing out for its elegant glassware. Known for its vibrant colors and intricate patterns, Cambridge Glass became a symbol of American craftsmanship and design. Today, visitors can explore this legacy at the National Museum of Cambridge Glass. Nearby, Mosser Glass continues the tradition with handmade pieces that blend classic style and modern techniques.

- **Mosser Glass**-Founded in 1971 by Thomas Mosser, Mosser Glass carries on the region's glassmaking tradition with vibrant handcrafted pieces like jade, pink, and carnival glass. Visitors can enjoy free guided tours Monday to Friday to watch artisans at work and learn the process. The showroom features a range of quality glassware, from classic to hand-decorated designs.
- **National Museum of Cambridge Glass**-The museum in Cambridge, Ohio, showcases over 10,000 handcrafted pieces from 1902–1958. Visitors can explore exhibits on glassmaking, including etching and engraving, try pencil rubbings from real plates, and view vintage films. Highlights include a dining room display, Sample Room, and a gift shop with authentic Cambridge Glass.
