### **Day One – Cambridge/Guernsey County**

#### **National Museum of Cambridge Glass**

## **Day Two – Amish Country/Roscoe Village**

**Roundhouse Museum**, located in Sugarcreek, houses team and diesel locomotives, passenger cars and other vintage United States and Canadian railroad equipment.

**Johnson Humrickhouse Museum** in Historic Roscoe Village features four permanent exhibit galleries highlighting Native American history, Ohio heritage, world cultures and innovation plus a rotating special exhibit gallery.

## **Day Three – Zanesville/Muskingum County**

Serving Cambridge fresh baked goods since 1925, **Kennedy's Bakery** has been a downtown tradition for generations.

**Midtown Market** in downtown Cambridge is a planned indoor food and gathering space with vendors, dining, and entertainment designed to bring more activity to the heart of downtown.

**The Alan Cottrill Sculpture Museum & Studio** in Zanesville features hundreds of bronze sculptures and a working studio where the artist creates on-site.

Lunch at **The Downtown Exchange** in downtown Zanesville for a grab-and-go featuring burgers, pizza and Greek favorites.

**The Stone Academy Historic Site** in Zanesville is a historic 1809 building that once served as a school and is now a museum highlighting local and Underground Railroad history.

**Day Four – Newark/Licking County**

**The Great Circle Earthworks** in Newark—part of the UNESCO World Heritage Hopewell Ceremonial Earthworks—is a massive ancient ceremonial site with towering earthen walls and a monumental gateway, large enough to fit the Great Pyramid of Giza inside.
