National Road (Route 40) - The All American Scenic Byway

Designated in 1827 by President Thomas Jefferson, the road became the nation's first interstate highway linking the Eastern Seaboard with the western frontier. This ribbon of road runs through the heart of the county and features several interesting sites, including unique "S" shaped bridges that span numerous creeks and streams and weave around historic sites. Stone House Museum, Salt Fork State Park

In 1837 Benjamin Kennedy, whose ancestors hailed from Ireland and Scotland, purchased an 80-acre tract of



land in Guernsey County, and built a two-story home from sandstone quarried nearby. During the mid-1900s the State of Ohio purchased the land and transformed it into Salt Fork State Park. In 2002, the Stone House Museum (the last remaining original homestead structure) was converted into a museum and placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The museum can be accessed by water, vehicle or hiking. (By Donation)
