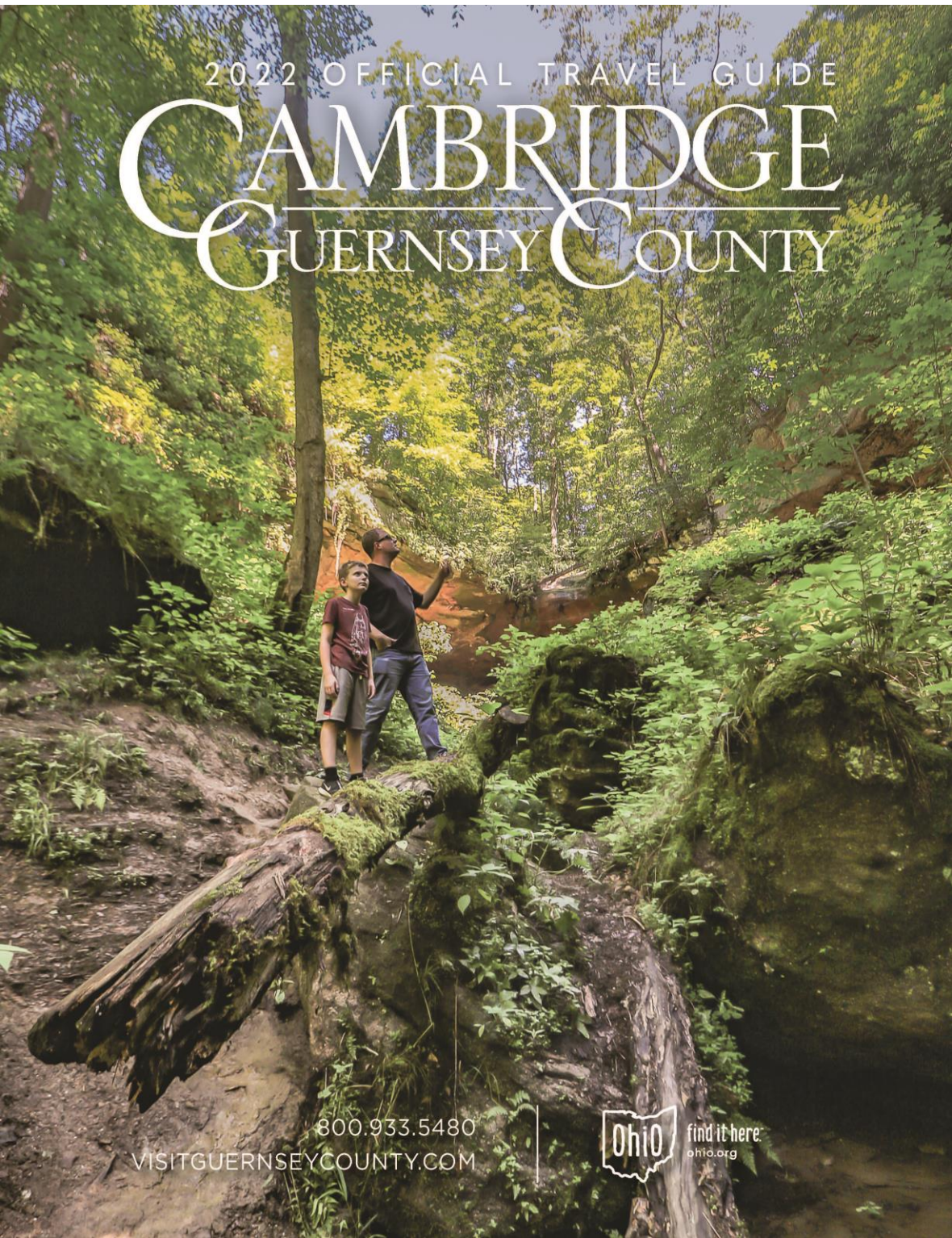
Robinson noted new photography graces nearly every page in the guide and the bureau has expanded the opening section to highlight additional points of interest to visitors.
