Two days/One night

Between 1802 – 1809, approximately 7,000 members of the Quaker Society (not to be confused with Amish or Mennonite Societies) flooded the Northwest Territory including Guernsey and Belmont Counties in Ohio. Your group will learn about the Quaker culture and other ethnic cultures that settled in our area during this riveting journey.

Day One

9:30am Begin the day at Old Washington, Ohio. Guide will meet your group there to begin your journey. Treats and a handout for each guest.

11:30am-12:30pm Lunch Choose from one of our many group-friendly restaurants.



1pm Go to the Head of the Class at the Guernsey County History Museum. Have fun learning the three R's while a school marm leads your group in a lesson and explains why the one room school houses dotted the land and were so important to 1800's education. Pay attention there will be a quiz after your lesson!

2:30pm Take a trip along the Hopalong Cassidy Trail that recognizes the impact of William Boyd, Cambridge Ohio's beloved cowboy hero, had on his hometown. A collection of Hopalong Cassidy items are on display throughout Historic Downtown Cambridge at various locations.

4pm check into host hotel

5pm Dinner

6:30pm The Living Word Outdoor Drama presents the only passion play in the state of Ohio. Your group can take a back stage tour before the 2 ½ hour presentation of the Life, Death and Resurrection played out on the largest outdoor set in the United States. Other evening options are available.

Day Two

Breakfast at host hotel

8am Depart for a tour of the Mosser Glass Factory where your group will experience glass making at its finest and enjoy shopping in their gift shop.

9:45am Step back in time by visiting the John & Annie Glenn Museum. The museum presents the life story of John & Annie Glenn through a series of engaging tours, featuring collections and galleries that contain special childhood treasures and memorabilia from Glenn's military, political and space careers. New in 2021 is the Annie Glenn Room.

11:30am Once the group has enjoyed their morning, a drive through Muskingum University with a docent will reveal how ministers and students were given a higher education at the first Presbyterian College west of the Appalachian Mountains.

Not quite ready to go home? **Enjoy one of these experiences:**

Historic Roscoe Village in Coshocton, Ohio (one hour drive) Canals were in their heyday and enabled Ohioans to transport people and goods. In August of 1830, the first canal boat docked at Roscoe Village and the vivid history of this port town began!

The Ohio Village in Columbus, Ohio (one and one half hour drive) A re-created mid-19th century Ohio town where your group can interact with costumed interpreters.
